

REFLECTIONS ON A "SPRING BATH" AT THE COTTAGE

As I enjoy my last few weeks in residence at Randell Cottage, I have been reflecting on the creative leaps the fellowship has afforded me, the hearty connections I've made, and the wonderful local walks, which lately have me feeling like I'm taking a 'spring bath'.

I've grown particularly attuned to the sensory richness of the location and am continually reminded of how rewarding it is to simply be aware of and present to place and moment.

To give insight into my research process, I have updated my website with two new projects https://rachel-oneill.com. The first is titled 'Listening practice' and features text, images, and audio examples of experiments I've undertaken in the last six months at the Cottage.

You'll also find a bonus recording of a new prose poem called 'The Lantern of Fear sausage sizzle', which playfully reimagines a sausage sizzle as phantasmagoria, a form of horror theatre popular in the 19th Century: https://rachel-oneill.com/portfolio/listening-practice/

The second project relates to my third book of poetry, 'Symphony of Queer Errands', a hybrid-form narrative poem that follows a composer attempting to create an irreverent symphony with a ribald orchestra.
